



Cyclone Marcia leaves a path of destruction in her wake



At its peak, Cyclone Marcia caused 69,500 premises to lose power, at least 1000 homes suffered structural damage and 385 properties have been deemed uninhabitable. The Insurance Council of Australia has received 8950 claims, with the estimated insurance losses now standing at \$53.4 million. These numbers are confronting, but they are nothing compared to the human suffering the cyclone caused.

National Youth Science Forum

SOME IMPORTANT MESSAGES, DOS AND DONTS and REMINDERS for 2015

Some significant changes to the NYSF in 2015 include:

- the application period has opened on March 1. This is one month earlier than previous years.
- students are charged a non-refundable application fee of \$60 when they formally submit their application to a Club. This is paid by the student directly to NYSF Canberra.
- the fee for the NYSF is now \$2950 per student. This is a significant increase from last year (17%) and has been necessary due to the loss of some university and corporate sponsors following the GFC and uncertainties around Federal tertiary funding.

Clubs are reminded:

- a student cannot attend the NYSF unless they are formally endorsed by a Rotary Club.
- it is not compulsory for Clubs to provide funding for an endorsed student. Clubs are encouraged to discuss funding with the student and their parents/guardians early in the process. Clubs are encouraged to have the students/parents/guardians contribute as much to the fee as they can. For students that are in needy circumstances Clubs can decide to contribute more to the fee or seek support from other Clubs to assist in sponsoring the student.

Clubs PLEASE **DO**:

- respond to all student enquiries.
- wait until May 31 to make your selections for the District Interview.
- discuss funding with the students/parents/guardians
- encourage students/parents/guardians to contribute as much as they can towards the fee.
- interview the students that you are interested in endorsing.
- be discerning as to which students the Club nominates for a District interview.
- advise me me by June 30 as to whom the Club is endorsing and selecting for a District Interview

Clubs PLEASE DO NOT:

- ignore student approaches.
- leave discussing funding until after the District Interviews and selections.
- nominate students for District Interview that do meet the NYSFselection criteria (see brochure).

All Clubs should have received in the Post a letter from the NYSF Canberra along with copies of brochures for the Club and brochures that the students/schools have received. In case these have been misplaced the files below have copies of these documents.

Purnululu Bus Project

The Purnululu School W.A., asked for assistance to purchase a 2010 Toyota Hi Ace 14 seater bus. The school has teachers and a great facility but some of its students and their families have been forced to move, due to poor housing, to another community some 35km away. A bus was needed to enable these students to attend school and maintain their friendships. The bus cost \$35,000 and through the partnership developed with the Lindsay Couzens Trust, the Trust donated \$27,486 and clubs in our District the remainder.


